# MISSIONARY STORY Angel of the Arnazon - Part 5 The story of Dr. Bill Woods, OBE

Do you remember how God had given Bill a great concern to help the leprosy patients of Brazil?

Do you remember how he had taken short courses in London to help him understand more about leprosy?

When he returned to Brazil, he put the things he had learned into practice by helping leprosy patients in the town of Canutama and in the villages along the river.

One day a 10-year-old boy was brought to Bill's house. He had been bitten by a snake, was very ill and was in a lot of pain. Bill helped him as best as he could, but he had only limited medicines and knowledge. Then a wonderful thing happened.



A plane landed on the river nearby. It was heading for Manaus, a large city, three hours flying time away. Bill ran quickly down to the river and asked the pilot if he could take the boy and his father with him to the hospital in Manaus.

That very day the boy was able to get surgery that saved his life. But his leg was so badly injured that the doctors decided to take it off. Life with just one leg is very difficult for anybody, but living in the jungle, it would be impossible to get around and to work.

Bill decided to take care of the young boy. He gave him an education and later took him to the city of Rio de Janeiro and have him fitted with an artificial leg.

During this time, Bill still felt that there was more that he could do. Maybe even more medical training? Even becoming a doctor? But wouldn't it be too hard for him to study medicine in university? God worked on Bill's heart. In the Bible we read "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God." (Luke 18:27) God has a plan for you and your life and He will not only lead you and guide you, but He will also help you to do things that you might think are impossible to do. God promises to never leave us. He will help us through many hard times, even through challenges that seem impossible.

God had helped Bill all this way and do you think He would now leave him alone?

He was even able to open up more workshops in several other cities and train people to make these shoes.
But Bill did not only fit these shoes, he also used the time to talk to the patients about his wonderful God and his Saviour Jesus, who can not only heal them from leprosy but can save their souls.

Then in 1974 he graduated as a doctor and would you believe it, he was top of his class!



All the students stood up to cheer him! Can you imagine how thrilled he he thanked God for making the impossible possible.

Bill left the same day of his graduation and started another two years of training in a hospital. He wanted to learn more about eve surgery, so that he would be able to help blind leprosy patients to see again. But he didn't stop there. After this he went back to Northern Ireland to receive further training in the Royal Victoria Hospital, followed by a month studying in Dublin and more courses in New York. He even went as far as India to learn more about surgery to help leprosy patients.

Where and What?



# All about the Amazon River "Rio Amazonas"



The Amazon River is the largest and widest river in the world in terms of how much water flows down the river and into the ocean. If we would put all the water from the next eight largest rivers in the world together, the Amazon would still have more water. Can you imagine? That is also why the Amazon is the widest river. In the wet season, which is between December and April, the Amazon can be up to 30 miles wide.

Just outside the city of Manaus the Amazon meets the River Negro (Black River). This is called "O encontro das águas" - The meeting of the waters. It seems that they don't mix and flow side by side for more than 30 miles. The Amazon carries a lot of sand and mud which gives it this orange, brown colour.





Along the river you can find many small communities that are only possible to access via boat. There is not one single bridge that crosses the river. Most of the river runs through the remote Amazon Rainforest and there are not a lot of roads in the forest but the river is almost like a motorway for the people who live there. Even large ocean boats are able to travel on the river as far as the important port city of Manaus, which is 900 miles upriver from the Atlantic.

The Amazon River is full of life. Over 2,000 species of fish but also some dangerous snakes live in there. A very special inhabitant is the Pink River Dolphin. It gets its name from, you will not believe it, their pink skin. These dolphins are known as the most intelligent of all the freshwater dolphin species. They are very friendly and like to swim with humans.





There are many indigenous people that live along the Amazon River, even deep into the Rainforest. There are about 400 tribes of people that live around the Amazon River. Some of them, like the Yanomamo and Kayapo tribe, do not have any contact to the outside world and many of them never heard about God.

Most of the Amazon River flows through Peru and Brazil but it also forms part of the border between Columbia and Peru.
You can find many smaller towns and villages along the Amazon River. The city of Manaus in Brazil is one of the biggest port cities along the river. This is where Dr. Bill Woods went to university.





## Brazilian Rabanadas



#### You need

- 1 loaf of french bread Baguette 2 cups milk
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tbsp. vanilla extract
- 0 0 0 0 5 eggs
- 🔪 1 tbsp. vegetable or canola oil
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 🔪 1 1/2 tbsp. cinnamon

- 1. Place medium-sized frying pan on stove and heat to medium-low heat and add the tablespoon of oil. While it is warming up, cut the bread into thick slices and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl mix the milk, sweetened condensed milk, and vanilla with a whisk until combined.
- 3. In small bowl, whisk the eggs together with the teaspoon of cinnamon.
- 4. In another medium bowl, mix the sugar with the cinnamon until cinnamon is evenly distributed.
- 5. Push a slice of bread into the milk mixture so that it is completely submerged for 10-15 seconds. Lift it out of the milk mixture and gently shake it so the majority of the milk drips off. Turn the slice over in the egg mixture a couple times so it is completely coated and immediately place it in the frying pan. 6. Let both sides brown for a few minutes. After both sides are cooked on the slices, remove and place them on a plate with a paper towel on top. This will absorb any oil residue. After a few minutes to cool, place each slice in the cinnamon sugar mix and flip so both sides are generously coated. Serve immediately.

### The Amazon green anaconda

#### You need

A4 Paper: 2 yellow, 2 green, and 1 red (for the tongue)

**%**Scissors

Glue Stick

- •• Googly Eyes (but you can also just draw them on)
- Hold the A4 Papers (yellow and green) landscape-oriented and fold them into four parts. If you now cut along the folds you will get 4 even strips.
- Now make a paper chain by first making one complete circle. Use the glue to hold the ends together.
- Next, thread another strip of paper through the first circle, and glue the ends shut. Repeat until finished.
- Try to use the yellow and green strips to create a pattern.
- Glue on the googly eyes or just draw them on
- Cut out a tongue from the red paper and glue it down.
- ... and you are done! Your own amazon green anaconda!
