Pastor Victor Maxwell, President of our mission, has written many books throughout the years. One such book is "A Light ForYourWay", a daily devotional book which takes the reader on a journey throughout the year, with various devotionals recounting events from the past on the mission field, and other thought provoking articles, all which point us toward our Lord and Saviour day by day. Here is one of the devotionals from the book:

The Lord Jesus was a young boy when He said, "I must be about my Father's business." I'm reminded of Hazel Miskimmin when she had to share a cabin with another lady when she left for Brazil. After exchanging some pleasantries, the lady remarked, "There must be some important people on the boat tonight for there was a big crowd at the quayside to see them off."

Hazel was a little embarrassed, but seized the opportunity to witness for her Lord, "Important people indeed. Our friends came to see us off. We are on the King's business for we are taking the Gospel of the Lord Jesus to Brazil." Hazel's missionary work had already begun before she even reached Brazil. There certainly is no business like the Father's business.

The Father's business is a great business. It is as great as the Father Himself. Nehemiah viewed God's greatness in rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem, "I am doing a great work, so that I cannot come down" (Nehemiah 6:3). Santo Andre Portugal

After two years of Pandemic, we were able, praise the Lord, to go back to Fátima to do the outreach work among the pilgrims. And we were able to go both in May and June.



In May, a team of five Northern Irish and two Portuguese joined us to distribute Luke's Gospel. One of the team members, a girl called Marina, is one of our daughter's friends from France. Marina is from a very devout Portuguese Roman Catholic background. She came



to Fátima as a pilgrim many times. She is now saved and always eager to testify. So when our daughter mentioned to Marina that we go twice a year to evangelize the Pilgrims in Fátima, she contacted us and came to help us (all the way from Paris). She was so thankful to serve our Lord there and to share the truth with her fellow Portuguese people. What a change the Lord made in her life.

In Fátima, there were less pilgrims than before the pandemic but we were able to give out many pieces of literature.

We had a great and blessed time of fellowship as a team, with lots of encouraging conversations.



On June 10th, ten nationals (from our local church and other churches) joined us to distribute a CEF booklet for children (Meet the King). June 10th is a public holiday and it is a special day in Fátima for children. There is a special mass for them there and many Catholic churches organize a special trip to Fátima with children and young teenagers so it is a great opportunity for us to give out Christian literature. This time again, there were less people than usual but we were able to give around 3,500 copies of these CEF booklets. It was wonderful to see the children grabbing the booklets as it was a free gift. There in Fátima nothing is free so the Good News of the Gospel was freely shared.

Fátima continues to be an open door to do evangelism and it is our privilege to serve the Lord in that way too. We are looking forward to having another team join us in October 2022 for another time of outreach in this needy town. Thank you for your prayers.



Santo Andre Testimony of Vítor Coelho



Vítor Coelho is a young man who started attending the church in Santo André, Portugal, back in 2019. Originally from Porto, he moved to the Alentejo area with his work, and sought out a church where he could worship God and meet other believers. We were pleased to have him join us on the recent Fátima outreach trip, and as a Portuguese national, he was a great help to us in connecting with and speaking to the Portuguese people. We asked Vítor if he would share his testimony with us, and this is what he wrote:

I was raised in a catholic family, even though when I was a child I knew about Jesus, I never got to know the full truth of the gospel. So I grew up as an atheist and believed in what I learned in school and on television. I always was a person that questioned everything and liked to understand how everything works.

So, as time went on, I started to believe in the invisible world and I looked for answers, through the internet and other people and from my own thinking, I read many things and theories about the spiritual world, what happens after death, about where we came from and what is our purpose. Many things contradicted themselves and I couldn't find a solid foundation. The pit I found myself in got deeper and deeper and was filled with even more shadows, and the wires of my mind were connected in all the wrong ways.

I enjoyed meeting girls, and of course I was only after one thing. However, one time I met a girl that denied me my lustful desires and said that she could only be with a man after marriage, and I asked why? She said because of her faith, that she believed in Jesus, and waiting until marriage was the biblical way to do things. I didn't understand, but I respected her viewpoint. She was the first Christian person I met who became a true friend, who cared for me and encouraged me to stop smoking, and would see the good things in me. Nevertheless, I didn't change my heart.

One day, in the midst of my suffering and mental torture and the chaos in my heart, I couldn't take it anymore and so I left the University library and walked to the hospital to find a psychologist. As I got there, I saw at the entrance of the hospital, a man whom I knew was standing there. We knew each other from jiu-jitsu practices, he was a man of around 40 years of age.

I greeted him and asked what he was doing there. He replied that he was there praying for some sick children who were in the hospital, and then asked me what I was doing there. I replied with the truth and opened my heart to him instead of simply inventing excuses and saying "everything's alright". And so, he understood me and my suffering and said that I needed God in my life, to help me end the chaos in my heart. We talked about the Bible, and he asked if I wanted to read it and so I installed it on my smart phone. He asked me if I had ever prayed, I said no, and so he suggested that I do it when I got home. And he said that it wasn't by chance that we met, but that God had planned this encounter.

I went back home instead of entering the hospital. At home I wrote some thoughts on a piece of paper and after that, I sat on the balcony floor, looked into the sky and said "If you really exist I need you to show me, I want to know you".

I started reading the Bible, I read 1 John; 2 John; 3 John and John's Gospel, in this order.

When reading the Bible a light shone into my heart, I knew that those words were life and truth, and that God was talking directly and personally with me.

I felt peace because I had found the way, the solid foundation for my life.

All that was lies was taken away, the wires of my mind were reconnected, the shadows were repelled and the pit was destroyed, instead there was built a temple for the Holy Spirit of God to dwell. The filthy rags were removed from my heart and it was no longer dark with sin but washed white and alive with a burning flame and I no longer wanted to destroy but to build and love.

When reading the gospel, I believed, and my soul was saved and now lives

eternally with Jesus Christ. Even without ever seeing him I believe in him, and I want so much to be with him and to see his face. That day will come and I long for it, and I know it will come because He said it.

Did I become a perfect person? No. Did I become a better person? Yes.

The things that changed are too much to be written, and I know that everyday God lives and is within me, and He works and perfects me.

If God changed my life he can change yours too, if you answer His call and accept Jesus in your heart, I promise you won't regret doing it.

Did the suffering and hardship of life suddenly stop? Is it easy to be obedient to God? No! But day by day God is working in my life, showing me things, and helping me to change, and to deal with those difficulties as they come along.

I'm thankful that Jesus has saved me, and He is resurrected and is alive, and will one day return again.

My Fátima Experience Phil Buchanan

For the last few years, I have attended the Revive Young Adults event and last summer I joined some of them to distribute Gospel literature into homes on the North Coast. As we worked, some of the team shared about their past experiences doing literature outreach at Fátima in Portugal. It sounded like a wellorganised and opportunistic outreach event to place a copy of Luke's Gospel into the hands of thousands of souls who were on a journey to seek God.

When details of the trip in May were released, I applied and researched further the goings-on at the famous Roman Catholic shrine. However, nothing I read prepared me for what I witnessed firsthand a few weeks later!

On our first day in Fátima, the team split into two groups and we positioned ourselves on either side of the main road leading to the shrine. I was grouped with Nicola, Pastor Aroldo and two Portuguese believers. We offered the walking pilgrims copies of Luke's Gospel and bottles of water as they climbed the long hill in the hot afternoon sun. Sadly, many folks declined the literature as they were 'travelling light' but such was the number of pilgrims, those who did accept it numbered thousands.





It was good to have the Portuguese folk with us as some people did engage in conversation about spiritual matters but there were so many people passing by, Nicola and myself were kept busy handing out the literature.

Later that afternoon, we made our way to the Basilica (shrine) to see where the pilgrims were actually heading! If I'm honest I found it quite disturbing and dark. One strange practice I observed hundreds of pilgrims doing, was buying life-size hollow wax moulds of body parts from little stalls around the shrine. Luke 19:45-46 immediately sprung to my mind!

There were legs, arms, heads, hands, hearts and even intestines! The pilgrims would then queue for hours to throw these wax moulds into a large furnace. Many of them were visibly emotional as they did so, hoping their action would bring healing to a particular part of their body. It was sad watching the people doing this and I wondered how their already non-biblical view of God would be impacted further if they didn't receive the healing they were seeking. The next day (Friday) was the largest mass of the pilgrimage so we split into groups of two and positioned ourselves on all the exit roads. As people left, we gave out thousands of Gospels in an hour. I guess many of them thought it was an official souvenir of Fátima, but we pray they read it and the Holy Spirit opens their eyes to the truth!

Only Eternity will reveal the full impact of literature distribution and the power of God's written Word in the hands of the unsaved. A living testimony of this is Marina, who previously came to Fátima as a seeking pilgrim, completely blind to the Gospel, but joined our team this year as a born-again believer, on fire for the Lord, seeking to point others to Christ.



The International Evangelical Church of the Algarve (IECA) is where our missionaries Mark and Judith Loney, Barry and Raquel Henry, and Glenn Bowden are based. In response to the growing need for places of refuge for Ukrainian people fleeing their country because of the ongoing war, the church has been able to offer a number of families a safe place to live, and to help them integrate into the local Portuguese area.



One of the things the church has been able to do, with the help and support of the congregation, is to rent a house near to Faro Airport which is equipped to house 4 families. After a 30 hour journey by bus, and car, these families arrived and got settled into the house, and others too arrived and were helped by other members of the congregation. It soon became obvious that there are many challenges ahead for these people, such as the language barrier, health requirements, schooling and the need for work etc. But the church members again stepped forward and offered help, with Portuguese language lessons, offering to transport people to various places, and simply offering them Christian friendship by inviting them out for coffee or for a meal.

"We are so thankful to the members of our congregation who donated so many things for the rented house, such as fridges, beds, a sofa and kitchenware, all to help the lives of these people to be more comfortable in the middle of their turmoil".

"We are currently looking for a smaller house or apartment for Sergii and Igor, who both want to stay in Portugal. They are both Christians and have a very positive attitude despite their situation.

And so we ask for prayer for this that God would provide accommodation, transport and fellowship for them. It has been a joy for us to welcome the Ukrainians into our church meetings, and we look forward to having them with us for this time, to worship God together, and to see Him work in their lives and circumstances, and we pray that many would find the Saviour in the middle of this trial that they are going through.

We would also ask for prayer as well for the ongoing situation in the Ukraine that very soon there would be a ceasefire, and that its people could once again live peacefully in their country".

As a mission we continue to pray for this humanitarian work which is being undertaken by the church, that God would help in every way, and that the church would also be blessed in having the Ukrainian people join with them at the church week by week. watched or were curious as to what was happening.

Pray for them as they continue their journey as disciples for Jesus wherever they may go. We thank the Lord as always for His faithfulness towards us and the work amongst the Portuguese speaking contingent of the local church here. May God continue to bless you all as you continue to pray for us.



Sunday 19th June 2022 was a very special day in the life of the Portuguese speaking church at IECA. Barry Henry writes:

"We had 8 candidates who obeyed the command given by Jesus to be baptised. It is always a special occasion for the church when this happens. We had two Brazilians, one Belarussian, one Northern Irish, and four Portuguese (one of which was our daughter Becky), who passed through the waters of baptism.

We held the baptisms at the beach in the nearby seaside town of Quarteira, and it was a great witness to those who

Sao Paulo do Potengi

Pastor Anderson



Pastor Anderson and his wife Vivaine have recently taken over the work in the church at São Paulo do Potengi, in the North East of Brazil. They replaced Pastor Diego and his wife Suzanna, who followed the call of God to move to the town of Sousa, in the state of Paraíba, to work with the church there. This is Pastor Anderson's report of the work he has recently taken up:

After а period of prayer and conversation, the Lord directed us to the church in São Paulo do Potengi. We are very happy and excited to be serving the Lord at this church. When we moved to the town, the journey took us eight hours by car. We travelled there with another Pastor called Paulo, and thankfully this made the journey less tiring. However, when we arrived, our bodies reacted to the change in climate, and we all became sick for a few days. After taking some medicine for a few days we all returned to good health once again. We are thankful for the prayer support of our other colleagues in the mission, and for those who kept in contact with us to find out how things were going.

Let me tell you about some of the activities we have been involved in at

the church. On Thursday's we have the Bible study, which is a time of praise, fellowship and teaching. It is a time that is set aside each week for the teaching of the scriptures, and to reinforce our Biblical understanding. These have been special times together as we learn more from scripture.

On Saturday's we meet again in the church for the children's work. We are thankful for the children who come along, and of course we pray that more boys and girls would come along to hear about the good news of the gospel.

On Sunday's we have our weekly meeting in the church, which is again a time to come and worship God, for the breaking of bread, and for the preaching of the Word. Most Sunday's we gladly welcome visitors to our church, and our prayer is that those still unsaved would give their lives to Jesus. We pray for maturity among our church members, as they grow and learn more about the faith.

Another important meeting which takes place weekly is our prayer meeting. This is a time of prayer for the needs of our church, our activities and for those who are still unsaved. Alongside these

weekly events we also have our times of outreach and evangelism. We go from door to door in the town, offering people gospel literature, and the opportunity to talk to us and ask questions. We thank God for a man called Francisco, who started coming along to the various meetings in the church. Recently he spoke with me and acknowledged that he understood he was a sinner, and wanted to give his life to Jesus. What joy it was to lead this man to the Lord. We ask for prayer for our future plans that we have to further reach out into the community. We want to offer music lessons to people, we want to go out and do open air meetings, and we want to hold meetings in people's homes. All of these activities have one goal in mind; to bring us into contact with people, and to give us an opportunity to share the gospel message with them. Thank you for praying for us and the work here in this part of Brazil.



Sao Paulo do Potengi is a municipality in the state of Rio Grande do Norte in the Northeast region of Brazil.

The village was upgraded to the status of a town in 1938 and has a population of 17,720.

Pastor Marcelo and his wife Ana Cristina recently began working with the church in Serra do Doutor. This church was previously looked after by Pastor Iranildo, who is the Pastor of the church at Campo Redondo. They prayed concerning the possibility of someone to come and help them with this church, and the Lord led Marcelo and his family to take up the task. Pastor Marcelo sends the following report:



We want to thank God for the great opportunity we have in serving Him here on the mission field. We also thank you, for your prayers for us and for this work here in Serra do Doutor. As a family we are in the process of adapting to this new place God has called us to. We have taken time to familiarise ourselves with the brothers and sisters of the church, as well as various tasks that come with the role of Pastor.

We have meetings in the church two times per week. We meet together on Thursday nights, and also on Sunday afternoons. We are thankful to those who normally join us each week for these meetings, and also for some of the members of the church at Campo Redondo who come and support the work and give help.

We also go to the church at Malhada Vermelha once a month to give assistance to the congregation there. In our church here in Serra do Doutor, we are thankful for the use of a loudspeaker, which can reach the houses further away from the church building. People around the church can now hear music, the preaching, and the announcements and invitations to other meetings.

In May we were able to commence some discipleship studies in the home of a man called Edson, and also in the home of a lady called Lucia. In each home other family members still not saved also listened in as we taught from scripture.

And so we would ask you to pray for

these new converts that they would continue to grow in their knowledge and love for the Lord Jesus, and that they would be able to be a good witness to their family members who are still unsaved.

We also ask you to pray for the other members of our church that they would become more involved in reaching out to others with the gospel, and that the fear of man which sometimes creeps in would be overcome as they try and witness to their neighbours, family members and friends. On a personal level can we ask you to pray that we would soon be able to find a house to rent that suits our needs and is within the local area where we want to be. Thank you for your interest in this work and may God bless you richly.

We are in Sousa now a bit over five months, and we praise God for how we as a family have churches. We are called to proclaim the Good news of the gospel to all men. And so, we have been holding meetings in the streets, especially in the area of Alto do Cruzeiro, where we want to plant a new church. We have been holding meetings in the homes of various brothers and sisters from the church, giving them the opportunity to come along and hear from God's word.

Alongside these meetings, every Saturday we have been going out on the streets of this district, in specific areas, distributing leaflets, and stopping to speak with people as they pass by and having the opportunity to read the bible with them and talk to them about the gospel.

We ask you to pray that all the church would get involved in this new project, and that the Holy Spirit would work and move in this district, that many souls would be saved.

Pray also that we would have much wisdom and guidance in this new work, we want to do this work to the best of our ability as we seek to expand God's kingdom.

After 3 long years since our last team went to Lanzarote, one of the team said "It feels like we have just come home". The warmth of welcome from the church family is always a great blessing and the encouragement from Pastor Ricardo & Sandra as we anticipate another two weeks of outreach with them.

Lyndsey from the team writes; "The first couple of days after we arrived, we started to get all the preparations done for the Coffee Mornings and the Camp at Church. The Coffee outreach was a real answer to prayer as many unsaved came in with some asking many questions. Three people received Bibles and some amazing conversations were had. Some had never heard the Gospel before! One lady who attended on her own the first morning brought her boyfriend the next morning again. She had rented a Bible out of the local library and showed definite signs of searching for something to fill the emptiness in her life. Please pray for Celine and Carlos. What a blessing to see them attend the church services each week when the team were there and have continued to attend since then. Carlos said after the first time he came to the church service that it was "awesome".

Our second week was Camp at Church. Although it was slightly different this time because of covid restrictions, over 60 children registered to come along each day to the church for the various activities. Some of the children had a little bit of Bible knowledge while many of them had never heard the Gospel before. The theme of the week was The Wordless Book and what a blessing it was to see the children drinking in every word. Proof of this was when they were answering the questions for the quiz. Singing, memory verses, guizzes, sword drill, hotspot, crafts and games were all part of the camp at church each day. Over 40 children went home with copies of God's Word. The parents were invited to attend on Friday afternoon to hear what we had been teaching the children through the week. At the end of the meeting, Keith asked that if any of the parents would like a copy of God's Word for themselves, that there were some available. We know of three parents that got one. We were very thankful for those who translated for us and for the wonderful cooks who made delicious meals for the children every day. Camp wouldn't have been possible without them!"



The team were involved in the church services, preaching, testifying and singing. It was a great opportunity and a great privilege to serve the Lord in Lanzarote. Thank you for your faithful prayers and support for this work. Please pray for Ricardo & Sandra and the church family as they continue to build on the work that has been done over the past weeks. A number of new contacts have been attending the church services over recent weeks and we ask prayer for the salvation of souls".

Another team member Joanna said; "It was amazing to see how the children responded to what they had been taught in God's Word each day and to see the look on their faces when they became owners of their first Bible."
